H. E. Dr. Abdullah Abdullah, Chief Executive of the Islamic Republic of Afghanistan

His Excellency Dr. Abdullah Abdullah is the Chief Executive of the Islamic Republic of Afghanistan. He is a key political figure in Afghanistan, who has held numerous prominent positions during his illustrious political career. Dr. Abdullah has earned the respect and admiration of world leaders, and his own people, as a voice of moderation and consensus. He is consistently working for peace and reconstruction in Afghanistan, and to implement a comprehensive reform agenda to achieve a peaceful, stable, democratic and prosperous Afghanistan.



H.E. Ambassador Hugo Llorens is the Special Chargé d'Affaires of the U.S. Embassy in Kabul, Afghanistan

Ambassador Hugo Llorens is the Special Chargé d'Affaires of the U.S. Embassy in Kabul, Afghanistan, where he leads the largest Embassy in the world with a multi-billion dollar budget, and a combined staff of 3,000 U.S. local and Third Country employees representing 19 U.S. government agencies. From October 2013 to 2016 he served as Principal Officer of the U.S. Consulate General in Sydney, Australia, where he directed the operations of the oldest diplomatic mission in the Asia Pacific region (established in 1836). Previously Ambassador Hugo Llorens was the Assistant Chief of Mission at the U.S. Embassy in Kabul from May 2012 to June a 2013.



H.E. Chargé MaryKay Carlson is the Special Chargé d'Affaires of the U.S. Embassy in New Delhi, India

MaryKay Loss Carlson, a member of the Senior Foreign Service with the rank of Counselor, is the Chargé d'Affaires at the U.S. Embassy in New Delhi. Prior to taking up the position of Deputy Chief of Mission at U.S. Mission India in August, 2016, she was Principal Deputy Executive Secretary in the Department of State's Executive Secretariat in Washington, D.C., where she led teams that support the principal officers of the Department and their staffs. From 2013 to 2014 she served as office director of the Executive Secretariat Staff.















H.E. Mr. Arun Jaitley, Minister of Finance, Government of India

Arun Jaitley is the current Finance Minister and Minister of Corporate Affairs in the BJP Government under Prime Minister Narendra Modi's ministry. He was member of the Bharatiya Janata Party, Jaitley previously held the cabinet portfolios of Commerce and Industry and Law and Justice in the Vajpayee government (1998–2004) and serving as the Minister of Defence in the Narendra Modi government as additional charge. From 2009 to 2014 he served as the Leader of the Opposition in the Rajya Sabha.[1][2] He is a Senior Advocate of the Delhi High Court.



H.E. Mr. Humayoon Rasaw, Minister of Commerce & Industries, Afghanistan

Minister Rasaw serves as Minister of Commerce and Industries of Afghanistan. Under Minister Rasaw's leadership, Afghanistan became the World Trade Organization's 164th member on July 29, 2016. Minister Rasaw holds bachelor's degree in natural science from Kabul University and a MA in information technology from the University of Preston. Minister Rasaw possesses specialized knowledge in economic leadership and industrial and economic development and has worked on various capacities in government organizations and international agencies in Afghanistan and abroad.



H.E. Ali Ahmad Osmani, Minister of Energy and Water, Afghanistan

H.E. Engineer Ali Ahmad Osmani is the Minister of Energy and Water of the National Unity Government of Afghanistan. He was born in Herat, Afghanistan. He holds his Bachelors in Civil Engineering from the Herat University, and his Masters in Hydraulic Structures from Ferdowsi University in Iran. Minister Osmani has almost two decades of extensive experience in energy sector with governmental and international organizations in Afghanistan. Minister Osmani also has the privilege of serving as professor at public and private universities in the country.















H.E Hekmat Khalil Karzai Deputy Foreign Minister of Afghanistan Kabul, Afghanistan

Mr. Hekmat Khalil Karzai was appointed as the Deputy Foreign Minister on January 21st, 2015. At the Ministry, he has chaired several national and international processes/forums including Heart of Asia- Istanbul Process, Regional Economic Cooperation Conference for Afghanistan (RECCA), and International Contact Group (ICG) amongst others. He led the Afghan delegations in the first face to face talks with the Taliban in July 2015 and at the Quadrilateral Coordination Group (Afghanistan, Pakistan, China and United States) meetings with a focus on creating an enabling environment for the Afghan peace process.



Mr. Loren Stoddard, Director of Economic Growth, USAID Afghanistan

Mr. Stoddard is the Director of Economic Growth for USAID Afghanistan. He served in Afghanistan previously as the Senior Development Officer in Mazar-e Sharif and as Director of Agriculture. Besides working in Afghanistan, Mr. Stoddard has spent twenty years working in economic growth, trade, and energy business development in Asia, Latin America, and the U.S. He is a graduate of the Thunderbird Graduate School of International Management and Brigham Young University.
